Timeline

- 2008: Surface and subsurface landowner Native Village of
 Tetlin starts to explore its mineral potential
- 2009: Contango began early exploration work
- 2015: Royal Gold became a joint owner
- 2018: Preliminary Economic Assessment complete
- September 30, 2020: Kinross becomes 70% majority owner and operator; Contango 30%
- Kinross initiates Scoping Study and honors all past agreements
 - To include Community Support Agreement and road maintenance funding
- 2020: Renaming from Peak to Manh Choh
- 2020-23: 2500+ community engagements and 19 job fairs

- 2021: Drilling and environmental field programs to support permitting and feasibility study
- 2021: Acquired the Westmark building and began construction
- 2021: Commitment to construct elder home when mine ends
- 2022: Received the Alaska Mining Association Environmental Stewardship Award
- 2023: Permits secured
 - Orientation trips and limited loaded trips
- 2024: Ramp up tucking operations
 - Finish Mill mods
- Mid-2024: Operations expected to begin; 4-5 year mine life

- Over 100+ public meetings and gatherings since 2021 including truck/trailer show and tell.
- Monthly in-person meetings with DOT Acting Division of Facilities Services Director.
- Actively participating in the Transport Advisory Committee (TAC).





Equipment



- B-Train (vs A-Train): greater stability and tracking through corners, season specific tires.
- Disk brakes: >30% reduced stopping distance, increased reliability & maintenance efficiency.
- Visibility: heated LED lights, elevated lights, amber rotating beacon, fenders on all axles.
- Materials Management: mechanically operated tarping system, single dump cycle.
- Fatigue management: Samsara Al interactive system with voice coaching for drivers, shift design.
- Dispatch/ driver monitoring: electronic logging device (ELD), Al driver/front/rear facing cameras, driver safety performance rating system, fleet tracking, speed governed.
- Siyata push-to-talk cellular comms: Reliable 'end to end' route coverage, GPS location ping, VHF compatible, fleet or individual communications.



Drivers



- Drivers with Northern climate experience.
- Classroom orientation: theoretical driver orientation & training.
- Route familiarization: drive routes in light vehicles, empty transport with single trailer, empty transport with double trailers.
- Loaded operation: Scale and load validation, reduced load transport, full load transport.
- Driver safety rating system in Samsura Al linked to driver safety incentive program.
- Driver pre-shift fit for duty checks, wellness programs.





Mine Operations

- First mining in South Pit
- Completed Ore Loadout Stockpile management plan

Geology: Geology database, software, hardware in place; OC workflow set up and ready for production

Mine Planning: Pit redesign process complete, completed first test run of quarterly forecast process. First blast with electronic dets. Short range planning cycle process (daily/weekly/monthly plan).


General: Onboarded geology manager. XRF purchase authorized. BV sample prep contract complete. RC drilling contract awarded. Onboarded first surveyor. Setup GPS base station.

- 22 sets of trailers at the BGT yard along with 52 trucks received in Alaska
- 64 hired, 122 pieces of equipment received
- Transported first ore in December
- Finalized BGT Emergency Response Plan
- Signed off hand over of MC access road from Projects to Operations



A new mining career pathway started with the Alaska Gateway School District in January.


